## CHAPTER i.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Ministry of Commerce under the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, relating to Larne Harbour. [9th April, 1936.]

A.D. 1936.

**W**HEREAS a Provisional Order made by the Ministry of Commerce under the General Pier and Harbour Act, 1861, is not of any validity or force whatever until the confirmation thereof by Act of Parliament :

And whereas it is expedient that the Provisional Order made by the Ministry of Commerce under the said Act and set out in the Schedule to this Act be confirmed by Act of Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, and the Senate and the House of Commons of Northern Ireland in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Order set out in the Schedule to this Act shall be and the same is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof in manner and form as they are set out in the said Schedule shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force.

2. This Act may be cited as the Pier and Harbour Order (Larne Harbour) Confirmation Act (Northern Ireland), 1936.

SCHEDULE.

CURRAN PIER AND LARNE HARBOUR.

*Provisional Order for amending the Curran Pier and Harbour Orders,  
1871 and 1888.*

Short title.

1. This Order may be cited as "The Curran Pier (Larne Harbour) Order, 1936"; and the Curran Pier and Harbour Order, 1871 (in this Order called the Order of 1871) and the Curran Pier (Larne Harbour) Order, 1888 (in this Order called the Order of 1888) so far as not repealed and as amended and varied by this Order shall be read and construed together with this Order as one Order; and the Order of 1871, the Order of 1888 and this Order may for all purposes be cited together as "The Curran Pier (Larne Harbour) Orders 1871 to 1936."

Commence-  
ment.

2. This Order shall come into operation upon the day when the Act confirming this Order is passed and that day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

The  
Undertakers.

3. Larne Harbour Limited, a company incorporated under the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, and the owners for the time being of the Pier and Harbour of Curran in the Parish of Larne in the County of Antrim, shall be the undertakers for carrying this Order and the Orders of 1871 and 1888 into execution; and this Order and the Orders of 1871 and 1888, so far as not repealed and as amended and varied by this Order, shall apply to the said undertakers accordingly.

Schedule of

repealed.

4. From the commencement of this Order the Schedule to the Order of 1888 shall be and the same is hereby cancelled and repealed, but nevertheless the undertakers shall be entitled to recover all moneys which shall have become due and payable to them under such Schedule or under any Order made pursuant to the provisions of the Harbours, Docks and Piers (Temporary Increase of Charges) Act, 1920.

New rates.

5. From the commencement of this Order the undertakers may, subject and according to the provisions of this Order and the Orders of 1871 and 1888, demand receive and recover for the use of the said Pier and Harbour and in respect of the vessels, persons, goods, fish, animals, things, and services described in the Schedule to this Order any sums not exceeding the several rates specified in that Schedule.

Power to  
vary and  
compound.

6. The undertakers may confer, vary or extinguish exemptions from, and compound with any person with respect to, the payment of rates or charges authorised by this Order, but so that no preference be in any case given to any person over any other person using the said

Pier and Harbour under the like 'circumstances and that anything done under this section shall not prejudice the other provisions of this Order, the Order of 1871 or the Order of 1888.

A.D. 1936.

7. The provisions of the Harbours, Docks and Piers Clauses Act, 1847, which are excepted from incorporation by the Orders of 1871 and 1888 shall not be incorporated with this Order.

Portions of Harbours Clauses Acts excepted.

8. All the costs, charges and expenses of or incident to the preparation and obtaining of this Order or otherwise incurred in relation thereto shall be paid by the undertakers.

¶ In all cases the fraction of a ton shall be charged as a ton.

Any vessel discharging or loading only part cargo to be allowed a reduction of tonnage rates.

1. All returned empties are exempted from payment of rates.
2. All goods landed and re-shipped on board the same or any other vessel without removal from the Pier Quays, or Sheds shall be liable to one rate only, provided that the goods were consigned in the first instance from the original forwarding point through to the destination to which they are re-shipped and no change of ownership of the goods has in the meantime taken place.
3. In charging the rates on goods weighed or measured the gross weight or measurement shall be taken. Fractional parts of any weight measure number or value shall be charged proportionately and the minimum charge for a single packet or thing shall be one penny.
